 By collaborating with the Chinese YMCA of Hong Kong, in total 6 face-to-face career workshops were held during the ASM periods throughout the year, for S1-S6. Upon receipt of feedback from class teachers and career team members, all were run smoothly and students were engaged in the activities in general. Joining the career workshops organised by "lam APP" in this academic year, S4 and S5 students are formally informed with the concept of life planning. In addition, students performed tasks related to career exploration and simple personality assessment. Students generally participated in the workshops actively and our school received the 5th place out of 55 participating school in terms of their participation in the application.

Major Concerns 5: Providing up-to-date information to support students to make well-formed choices for further studies (in response to School's major concern 1)

 To offer career guidance to S6 students, throughout the year a series of career guidance videos were made by members of the team. With the collaboration with S6 class teachers, all S6 students (except 3) created their JUPAS account and applied for UGC-funded university programmes via the platform. About 50% of S6 students created an account on E-APP before the release of DSE results, and some were given conditional offers in advance. 8 students applied for Mainland further studies via the Scheme for Admission of Hong Kong Students to Mainland Higher Education Institutions, all of them were nominated under the Principal's Nomination Scheme. Recommendation letters were written by class teachers and/or career team members throughout the year to assist students in achieving their personal study plans such as studying overseas and joining scholarship schemes, etc. 		Partially achieved

 Achievements In total, 5 admission seminars offered by different tertiary institutes covering the 2 major pathways of further studies (EDUHK, CITYU, HKUST, HKUSPACE and HKCC) were held. An Information Booth was set up by VTC on DSE Results Publication Day. S6 Parents' Day was held on 9 October 2022. Post-parents' day reflection forms were collected to enable students to reflect upon their programme choices and set targets for their further studies. S3 Parents' Night was successfully held on 9 Dec 2022. Guidance on selecting elective subjects for S4 and the TASTE Program and ApL, was introduced. S3 TASTE Program was held between Feb and May 2023. The Career Guidance Session was smoothly operated overall, students actively participated the session. The logistics of the whole program was simplified this year. Written assessment was introduced this year. 24 students have applied to study Applied Learning Courses in the 2026 HKDSE. An information session was held prior their application. Students are well-informed about the ApL arrangements. Booklets and pamphlets related to life planning and further studies were passed to YYK and displayed in the school library on a regular basis. G21 committee site was updated on a regular basis - parents and students could access the relevant information at ease with the login of their Google account. Other life planning tools, can be considered to be included in the site as well. Reflection Students could not choose to attend some of the institute' admission seminars 	Partially
 Students could not choose to attend some of the institute admission seminars out of their own interest, the seminar may not gain students' full attention. The logistics of the S3 TASTE assessment may be too complicated and only applicable to this year's academic schedule. The overall planning of the TASTE Program will have to be simplified to fit in next year's schedule. Regarding to the ApL arrangements, the information provided to students is a bit rush, students may not have sufficient time to decide if they should choose ApL carefully. Information placed in the library may not be sufficient and students seldom find information there. Feedback and Follow up Some of the institute which provide general admission information could be 	
 compulsory for all students to attend it, while students can choose the others out of their own interests. The arrangement of the TASTE Program Assessment may have to be arranged during after-school periods / holidays to fit in next years' schedule. The selection criteria for students and timeline to apply ApL could be listed explicitly to students and encourage them to participate in the taster courses before applying the ApL. A resource room for career guidance information and career counseling could be considered in the coming academic year.
